The Demasi Vineyard

The backbone for our Blood Knot Shiraz is Tom and Carolyn Demasi's vineyard at Blewitt Springs. One of the most colourful characters in the Vale, Tom is miner turned chicken, beef and lamb farmer, but most importantly to Longline is his 2 hectare vineyard.

Tom grew up in Broken Hill and when he was 18 went underground mining silver, lead and zinc, a job that he continued for 28 years. Having decided that an agricultural pursuit was more to his liking, Tom and Carolyn packed their bags for McLaren Vale settling on a 20 hectare cattle property at Blewitt Springs. Their 20 year old Shiraz vineyard was planted by Tom and Carolyn themselves and apart from the odd squirt of water as young vines from the water cart they are dry grown. The vines thrive in the deep sands over clay and ironstone in one of the coolest parts of the Vale.

Tom's Vineyard is a beauty and produces powerful yet restrained Shiraz with classic Blewitt Springs character. A vineyard where a vintage visit is guaranteed a number of classic stories and lines from a great character. We feel lucky to play with their fruit each year.

2015 Bimini Twist Grenache Rose

Our inaugural Rose last year was a hit and found it's way into a host of restaurants for the warmer part of the year including the iconic Victory Hotel where proprietor Doug Goven poured it all summer. We haven't changed too much for 2015 with fruit coming from a single site in Blewitt Springs and it has produced a wine with aromatic bright Grenache perfume with juicy fruit and savoury notes. It's dry and complex and it's the type of Rose we love to drink.



2014 Albright Grenache


The vintage of 2014 was very kind for old vine Grenache with a very even and long ripening period which has resulted in wines with great flavour and fine tannins. Open fermented on skins for 4 weeks and matured in large old french oak barrels for 9 months prior to bottling. The 2014 Albright is bursting with red fruit flavour, savoury complex character and fine tannins. Definitely medium bodied and made in an elegant style, the 2014 Albright, we think, is the best we have made thus far.



2013 Blood Knot Shiraz

Blood Knot is a blend of 2 vineyards from Blewitt Springs (Demasi Vineyard) and Hope Forest (James Vineyard). Both sites produce wines with amazing fruit brightness and spicy Shiraz character. Blewitt Springs definitely is the more powerful and generous, giving the Blood Knot it's rich fruit, whilst Hope Forest is perfumed and full of spice with fine tannins. The 60% McLaren Vale/ 40% Adelaide Hills is a blend highlighting the best of both regions.

James Halliday's Wine Companion tasting note: A synergistic 60/40% blend from McLaren Vale and Adelaide Hills, the outcome very impressive, iron fist in velvet glove stuff. The beautifully presented black cherry, blackberry and spice fruits seem more closely linked to Adelaide Hills than McLaren Vale, but that's not worth debating given the sheer class, balance and length of the palate.
